

How to prepare for your Colonoscopy

with OsmoPrep Tablets

*Please read over these instructions carefully as soon as you receive them.
If you have not prepared for your colonoscopy properly, your appointment will need to be
rescheduled for a later date.*

One week before your colonoscopy

- ✓ Fill your prescription for OsmoPrep tablets
- ✓ Buy items for the Clear Liquid Diet. (see list)
- ✓ Arrange for transportation to and from your colonoscopy. You will not be allowed to drive yourself or use a taxi or bus service unless you have a responsible adult to accompany you.
- ✓ Review the special medication instructions and identify which medications (if any) you will need to stop taking before your colonoscopy.
- ✓ **Stop taking iron supplements (multivitamins containing iron are OK).**

The day before your colonoscopy

- ✓ **Begin the Clear Liquid Diet (see list). The whole day will consist of clear liquids. There is no limit to the amount of clear liquids you can drink during the day.**
- ✓ At 5pm, begin taking the OsmoPrep tablets. Take four tablets with an 8 oz. glass of any clear liquid. Repeat this step every fifteen minutes until you've taken a total of 20 tablets (five doses). Set aside the remaining twelve tablets for the following day.
- ✓ Stay hydrated by drinking additional clear liquids.
- ✓ Set your alarm to wake you at least five hours before your colonoscopy so that you can finish preparing for your procedure.

The Clear Liquid Diet

The clear liquid diet begins the day before your colonoscopy. It can include:

Water

Clear Broth

Bouillon

Soda

Gatorade (no purple, red, or orange)

Clear Fruit Juice (apple or white grape)

Popsicles (no purple, red, or orange)

Jell-O (no purple, red, or orange)

Italian Ice (no cream or fruit)

Coffee or Tea (no milk, cream, or dairy substitutes)

NO solid food

NO purple, red, or orange colors

NO milk, cream, or dairy substitutes

The day of your colonoscopy

- ✓ Hold all insulin and diabetic medications morning of procedure.
- ✓ Hold diuretics (HCTZ/furosemide) morning of procedure.
- ✓ Continue all other medications.
- ✓ Five hours before your colonoscopy, finish taking the OsmoPrep tablets. You should take four tablets with an 8 oz. glass of clear liquid. Repeat this step every fifteen minutes until you've finished all twelve of the remaining OsmoPrep tablets.
- ✓ **Do not eat or drink anything after you finish the OsmoPrep tablets (except medication with a sip of water).**
- ✓ Make sure that you arrive for your appointment on time.

Remember, your appointment will be rescheduled if:

- ✓ **You have food or drink on the day of your colonoscopy.**
- ✓ **You do not follow the preparation instructions.**
- ✓ **You do not arrive for your appointment on time.**
- ✓ **You do not have a ride home.** Medications will be given to you at the time of your colonoscopy that will impair your judgment and reflexes. You will not be able to drive yourself, and you will only be able to use a taxi or bus service if you have a responsible adult to accompany you.
- ✓ **You have a change in your health insurance coverage.** Your new plan may require us to obtain authorization before performing your colonoscopy, a process that can take some time. Please notify us of any changes to your insurance immediately.
